## Lizzie Owens of Highland

**Who she is:** The Salt Lake City native graduated from the Rhode Island School of Design in 2005 and got her big break designing wovens at cashmere brand TSE, where she worked for four years before taking some time off to create music-video costumes for bands like MGMT, the Killers and Chairlift. During a brief stint in L.A., Owens teamed up with her business-minded cousin Cramer Tolboe and family friend Mike Franks to form her menswear label Highland, named for a scenic road in Utah. "It's a lot more predictable than womenswear and less trend-driven," she says. "I like having that limitation."

**About the line:** Headquartered in Chinatown, Highland caters to style-minded guys who are as rugged as they are creative. Owens's signature Southwest- and Patagonia-inspired prints touch everything from button-up shirts to slim-fit pants. "This tribal, psychedelic side is always going to be part of my aesthetic," she notes. The steep price tags on Highland's spring collection (\$80–\$850) are due to the



brand's top-notch fabrics, such as loose-weave Scottish wool and super-soft cotton-silk blends.
